

Women's safety

Svalöv municipality would actively combat violence in all its forms. Violence in intimate relationships is a devastating social problem that can not be handled the same way as other crime.

To a woman:

Are you afraid? Do you feel threatened? Have you been beaten?

Have you been forced into sexual acts?

Although you that you can be exposed and / or you are living in a same-sex relationships. We are here to help you if you are a victim of violence / threats regardless of creed, gender or sexual orientation.

Neither your husband, partner, partner, father, brother or son has the right to beat you. The debt is not yours. Anyone who does violence is solely responsible.

Svalöv Municipality offers help, support and interventions for both victims as aggressors. We work after the child's perspective and places great emphasis on protecting and supporting children who lived with family violence.

We work confidentially and you can be anonymous in touch with us.

We look to you who are feeling insecure in your daily life and who is or has been exposed to physical, psychological or sexual violence.

You can get help with:

- Professional advice
- Support, referral and information
- Biståndsbedömning under the Social Services Law
- Accommodation
- Sheltered accommodation with staff in other municipalities
- Foster home for young girls / boys
- Support and help for your children
- Treatment Call for violence manufacturer

We are working on a global perspective and collaborate, where appropriate, with other authorities to ensure your safety!
